



Connecting with Local Schools

Here are some tips for contacting a school and getting your field trip started.

- Identify the public and private schools containing grades 5 and up closest to your golf course.
 Look on their websites for the names and contact information of the school principal and science program coordinator or teachers.*
- 2. Send an email to the principal and teacher introducing yourself and your golf course. A sample message is provided below.
- 3. Follow up the email with a phone call. Very often you'll get voice mail so leave a message similar to your email message.
- 4. If you don't get a response within a week, repeat the process of sending an email and calling. This time you may get through to one or both of them.
- 5. Persist as teachers are busy—they get a lot of emails every day.
- 6. Be sure to encourage them to look at the First Green website (www.thefirstgreen.org), especially the videos. It is a good way to start the conversation with them.
- 7. Remember that schools must schedule field trips well in advance of the date in order to get all arrangements made.
- 8. Once you get connected to the school and host a field trip, you won't have any problems with future trips. Getting the conversation started is the hardest part.
- * If you have a club member with a connection to a school, or if the school's golf team practices at your course, ask the club member or golf coach for an introduction.
